
## Kaska - B.C. Land Use Planning

#### **About this Survey**

The Kaska First Nations and the Province have formed a joint Project Team (the Project Team) to work in partnership on a collaborative land use planning process within 99,000 km<sup>2</sup> of Kaska Dena ancestral territory in British Columbia.

We invite you to participate in this survey to share your values and priorities. Your responses will inform the development of a draft Land Use Plan.


#### Background

The heartland of the Kaska-B.C. Land Use Plan Area is a region of cultural significance and ecological importance. It is one of the last major intact landscapes in British Columbia and central to the identity of the Kaska First Nations who call it Dena Kayeh.

In the spirit and practice of reconciliation, the Project Team is working together on developing a stewardship plan that will identify areas to protect and enhance biodiversity, as well as manage zones to promote community economic priorities. It will foster cultural initiatives, Indigenous Guardians, tourism opportunities, and provide for the continued enjoyment by outdoor enthusiasts.

A key part of this project is the proposed Dene K'éh Kusān Indigenous Protected and Conserved Area (IPCA) – a 39,000 km2 area that reflects the vision of the Kaska First Nations' ancestors to steward the lands and waters into the future. Dene K'éh Kusān means 'the people's way we follow'. The Project Team follows this path in partnership so this special place will always be there for the benefit of present and future generations.

The planning process is guided by a shared land stewardship vision. This marks a new, yet continued, path forward that builds on existing land use plans. It is a path that will advance reconciliation, address conservation goals, promote climate resilience, provide shared economic opportunities, and bring land use clarity. The planning process will identify sustainable resource management opportunities to meet mutual economic, environmental, social, and cultural objectives.



The project represents a shared commitment between the Province and Kaska to work together to support Indigenous leadership in caring for the land and to create a land use plan that reflects the priorities of Indigenous communities, all British Columbians, and supports the Province's goal to protect 30% of lands and waters by 2030.
